Mrs. Baird & Mrs. Deboer's Kindergarten class at Grand Bend Public School participated in the OWF Earth Day contest with this submission:


"We had a lot of fun celebrating Earth Day. In addition to planting seeds, we also picked up garbage on the school yard! Thank you!"



Q: Why are rabbits so lucky?


A: They have four rabbit's feet!
